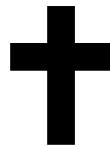

Parish Organizations

Eucharistic Ministers: Lay ministers assist with the distribution of the Holy Eucharist at Mass as well as to those who are homebound and in nursing homes.

Music Ministry: Musical accompaniment at each weekend Mass serves to enhance the liturgy and to encourage participation by the congregation. Choir rehearsals are held on Tuesday evenings.

Liturgy Committee: This committee collaborates with the various parish ministries to enhance Sunday Mass and seasonal celebrations throughout the year. Meets monthly.

Altar Rosary: This women's group serves the parish by cleaning the sanctuary and sacristy, laundering the altar linen and making infant baptismal bibs. Members pray the Rosary at monthly meetings.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA): RCIA is the process by which adults are initiated into the Catholic faith. Candidates prepare for the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and/or Confirmation.
