Spotlight on Antonina Nicdao “Dags” Parishioner and Volunteer



Antonina Nicdao, called *Dags*, has been a member of St. Thomas More Parish since 1986. Dags was born in the Philippines in the province of Luyon. For a time she lived with her grandparents in Manila and then returned to Luyon where she learned many trades including sewing and hair styling. As a teenager she often went to the movies to see American films. This experience of American culture caused her to consider coming to the United States.



In 1971 Dags was invited by a family friend to go to the United States and serve as their Nanny. Dags lived and worked for this family for 11 years. After a short time back in the Philippines Dags returned again to the United States and worked with the Duffy Family of St. Thomas More Parish. Dags shared, “They treat me like a family member and I love them.”

Dags became involved in St. Thomas More Parish by joining the Women’s Club and a Small Christian Community. She also volunteered to help Ann Vigrass in the weekly cleaning of the church. Small Christian Community Faith Sharing

Please note that we put the following week's Gospel passage in this space so you can prepare all week for the proclamation of the Gospel the following Sunday.

Faith Sharing helps ordinary people connect their faith with everyday life experiences.

Excerpt from the Gospel for the Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 13, 2011 - Matthew 5:17-37

Jesus said to his disciples: I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the Kingdom of heaven.

"You have heard it said to your ancestors, 'You shall not kill'...but I say to you, whoever is angry with brother or sister will be liable to judgment."

"You have heard it said, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery in his heart."

"Your ancestors said, 'Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that you vow.' But I say to you, do not swear at all."

Commentary:

One by one, Jesus takes, the various laws, in all their externality and draws out **their inner roots**. One injunction had been against *killing*. But the inside of that law is, do not ever act out of anger for your brother (or sister). Not even the word *raqa* may be spoke. *You shall not commit adultery*. The inside of that law is, be pure enough to not even look lustfully at a woman. And, *divorce*. The interior law is to stay faithful and loving within your marriage relationship. Finally, the matter of *oaths* and swearing. Jesus diagnoses this simply: you are trying to make up for your weakness by putting almighty power behind your words. Just say yes or not, and mean it. Why does Jesus dig so deep? The inside of the law is written in Jesus' heart. May it be written in ours as well.

Questions for Reflection and Sharing:

1. Share something from the reading or the commentary that spoke to you.
2. Jesus challenges his disciples to a deeper understanding of the law. How is Jesus challenging you to a deeper spirituality?
3. Jesus calls us to resolve our anger with our brothers and sisters. Is there a relationship in your life that needs healing?

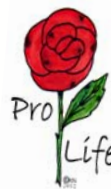
